## FAKE BRAIN SCIENCE

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I have hit optical illusions before: see my paper on the color-morphing "the dress" as just one example. Today we will look at the image above, sold to us today as a lead story at getpocket.com. We are told that is an example of an optical illusion, since both skulls are actually red. It is supposed to be an example of the Munker-White illusion, and it is supposed to be due to the color-completion effect. The phenomenon causes the color to skew to the color around it.

However, that is obvious misdirection, and I now think these optical illusions are being sold to us as part of Operation Chaos, and specifically the newer life-is-a-hologram nonsense. You see, they want you confused, and one way to do that is to make you question your eyes and brain. They want you doubting your own ability to see the world and to make sense of it. If you doubt your own eyes, you will also doubt your ability to read all the hoaxes around you. You will think that maybe you are just wrong, as with this optical illusion.

But that picture above isn't really an optical illusion. Your brain isn't shifting anything, and you aren't seeing something that isn't there, or making a mistake. If you look closely, you will see that both skulls aren't just red. Yes, they are both composed of red lines. But the first one is composed of red lines and blue lines. The second is composed of red lines and yellow lines. So all your brain is doing is averaging. You have pulled back from the image, so you are reading a composite. That is all that is going on here. In color or paint mixing, red+blue=purple. Red+yellow=orange. So your brain is just seeing both colors at once, and averaging for you. On average, the first skull is purple. On average, the second skull is orange. So technically this isn't even an optical illusion. It doesn't require advanced physics or psychology to figure it out, so it is pretty weird that they are claiming in the article that "no

one knows for sure" what is going here. Do you really think physicists and psychologists can't figure this one out, using simple averaging and color mixing? Do you think Munker and White couldn't figure this out, or that it was so mystifying they needed to give the new "phenomenon" a name? There was already a name for it: color averaging.

Do you really think David Novick, the computer scientist at University of El Paso promoted in this article, can't figure this one out? But he probably received federal grant money for an extended study of this, so that he could come to the conclusion it was the "color-completion effect". Oh, and Novick is Jewish, of course. Oh, and this links us to El Paso for the second time in two days, since I just put up a paper on the El Paso shooting hoax yesterday. It is looking like a pretty spooky place, isn't it? My guess is that this is no coincidence. They are selling you this fake optical illusion as back-up to their fake shooting of a few weeks ago. They don't want you looking closely at that, or anything else, so they don't want you to trust your eyes, or your ability to think. This is one of the things they do in psychological operations units.

You might also ask yourself why they chose a skull for this demonstration. You can be sure it wasn't an accident.

Which brings us back to that. Clearly, the shooting event in El Paso was run out of Fort Bliss, which is —except for White Sands Missile Range—the largest army base in the world. It has the largest restricted air space in the US, even larger than the Nevada tests sites like Area51. Bliss is the home of the El Paso Intelligence Center (EPIC), which is run by DEA and Customs, both of which are arms of DHS. EPIC greatly expanded in 1999, and has been expanding ever since, due to increased funding via DHS. So all these people have to find something to do. I think we now know what that is.

In 2005, Fort Bliss ballooned with almost 12,000 more soldiers from the 1<sup>st</sup> Armored Division, which had up to then been stationed in Germany. Another 16,500 personnel joined them, making a total *increase* of about 33,500. This also created another 20,000 jobs in El Paso, so you begin to see how it is.

You may also be interested to know that Fort Bliss is tied to Operation Paperclip, by which German scientists were smuggled into the US in 1946, and housed there.



Over 1,600 German scientists were secretly moved to the US by Army Intelligence. We will study this story in more detail later, but just ask yourself if it makes any sense. We are told the Operation was secret, but the press was interviewing some of these people about the project in late 1945. And why would these German scientists agree to work for us? None of them were patriotic at all? The US Army had no problem kidnapping 2,200 people (including the families of the scientists), although many of them were in the Soviet Occupation Zone? The Soviets had no interest in protecting these assets and had them under zero security? When these people were ordered to report by US Military, and told to bring valuables with them, not one of them thought to flee or disobey orders? Not one asked for asylum from Russia or Poland or Finland or Sweden or Switzerland? Just put yourself in their places. If you are a top Nazi scientist and the US military orders you to report, with clothes and valuables, you will assume they are going to try you for war crimes and steal all your stuff, right? So you just quietly go along, making sure to carry lots of cash and diamonds?

When they were kidnapped, no one filed complaints with the international bodies, claiming many laws and treaties were being broken?

I would ask you to consider the possibility these scientists were not "stolen" at all. Since I have previously shown you the entire war was managed from the first shot, and that the Nazis themselves were a fake construction, that gives us a whole new view of this. These scientists were never working for Germany. Germany was the pre-planned loser of WWII, so no one was working for Germany. These people may have been in Germany, but they were assets of the international bankers before, during, and after the war. They did what they were told, as people like this do. We may assume that most or all of them were from the same families as the bankers, so they had no problem following orders. They benefitted greatly from following orders. Most or all of them were Jewish. Remember, we have seen that Eva Braun was Jewish. They now admit it in the mainstream press. Well, remember Werner von Braun. Just a coincidence, right?

Operation Paperclip was just a transfer of assets from Germany to the US. Once the plug had been pulled on Germany (for the second time), these prominent people naturally didn't want to live there. They wanted their unjust rewards, which included moving to the US and getting paid handsomely by the pre-determined winner. This explains their apparent lack of patriotism: their ties were never to Germany, their ties were to their families, who were running the war from both sides. There never were any "German scientists" or "American scientists". There were just Jewish scientists, working for their international families. As now.

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
