Sure They Did, Chief

In the stupidest story of the week, we find one from the Denver Museum of Nature and Science, which contains alleged dinosaur fossils.

Even stranger, through Natalie Krokaugger, this Natalie Toth links us to Samuel Krokaugger of Salt Lake City, sentenced to life in prison at age 19 in 2008 for two homicides. Both Natalie and Samuel are related to Kent Krokaugger, giving us a hard link. Note the date of that press release: October 18,

2008: aces and eights. And yes, that event looks faked, since if he pled guilty why was he expected to address "dozens of family members of the victims gathered in the courtroom"? If you plead guilty, there is no trial, so what were all these people doing in a courtroom?
