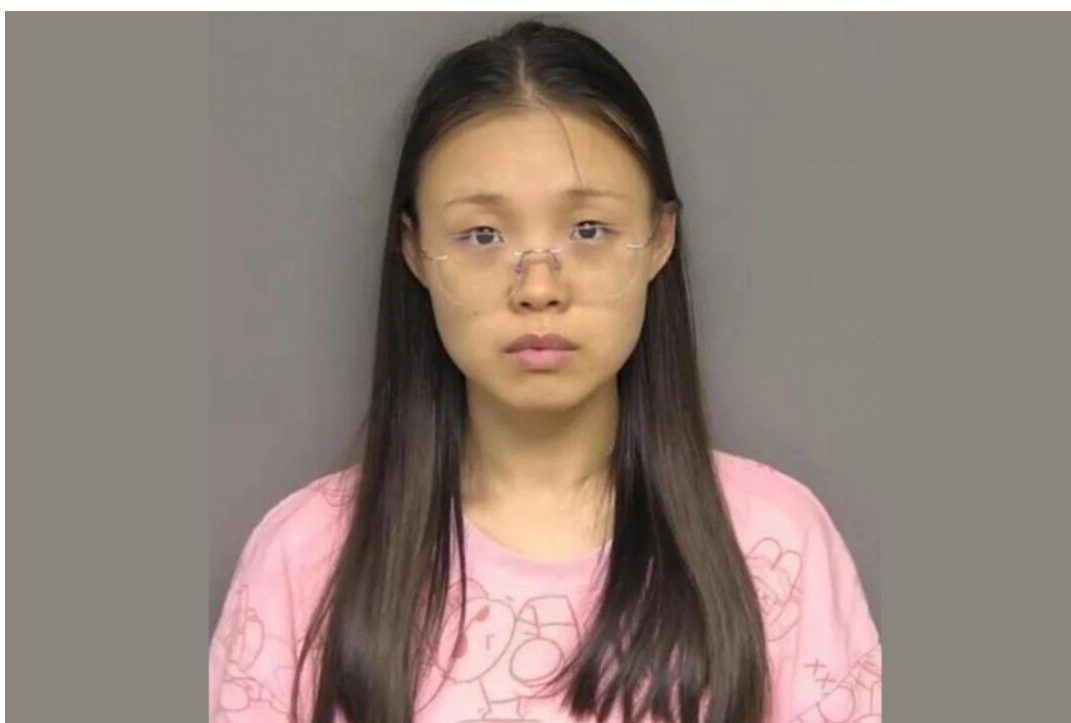




OK, time to play *What's Wrong with this Picture* again. Here is today's picture, straight from world news headlines:



That is allegedly Chinese scientist Han Chengxuan, or Chengxuan Han, depending on which source you are reading. She just pled no contest to smuggling banned biological materials and lying to customs officials. She allegedly flew over from Wuhan to University of Michigan, where she was to begin a one-year research project. We have several problems in the text there, which I will get to, but the main problem is in the photo. I will give you a few moments to think about it.

The main problem is. . . she is way way WAY too pretty. She is wearing no makeup and they have given her those big glasses to wear down on her nose, but through that magnificent disguise I can still tell she is a model. Meaning, an actress, hired for her looks. This is somewhat like putting glasses on Linda Carter back in the day and expecting you to think she is no longer Miss America/Wonder Woman. But since I

am an artist, used to working with beautiful women, I saw through this in under a second. This Chinese girl isn't just a ten, she is thousand or a hundred thousand, with looks that qualify her in China as a top model.

But I have to admit I was not prone to believe this story even without that, since I could see what it was about coming in. This story is all part of the Covid/vaccine fraud, by which entities like Fauci and Pfizer are trying to cover their tracks by pinning blame on China for the release of the Covid virus. This current story supports that story by making you think many Chinese agents are doing similar things, smuggling illegal biological agents into the US.
