

Laura Helmuth Hits Pavement



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UnScientific American joined CNN and the *Washington Post* in their fiery CIA conflagration this week. After years of heavy strafing by me, *UnScientific American* is now crashing into the sea due to the damage. May they all rest in peace in Davy Jones' Locker.

The most bloated body thrown from the wreckage is Laura Helmuth, above, who just resigned in disgrace after having a very public Trump meltdown. But she has been melting for decades, having been under the CIA heatgun since the beginning. She comes out of Berkeley, where she got a PhD in cognitive neuroscience. Chandler Helmuth is her brother and he is a Vice President of Network Operations for American Express in Phoenix. He links us to [Grahams](#), but possibly through his wife. Karen Chandler, 77, appears to be the mother. That's interesting because one of Ted Bundy's fake victims at Florida State was named Karen Chandler. She should be about 68 now, unless she was 31 playing 22, which is not out of the question.

These people searches indicate Laura Helmuth now lives in Derwood, MD. Strange, since the editorial offices of *UnScientific American* are at 1 New York Plaza. Neither Radaris nor Instantcheckmate give us any address in New York for her, though she has lived in DC and LA. Maybe they choppered her in every morning. But Derwood *is* just north of Bethesda, confirming my CIA guess.

UnScientific American is now owned by Holtzbrinck, so it isn't even American. It is out of Germany, being a former Nazi publisher. Amusing, since of course the von Holtzbrincks are Jewish. They are now [major donors to the Jerusalem Foundation](#). Strange for former Nazis, eh? They have been Austrian nobles since 1694, and they were billionaires long before they got into publishing.
