A picture truly is worth a thousand words. What do you think—would a *sea captain* ever work as a street cleaner?

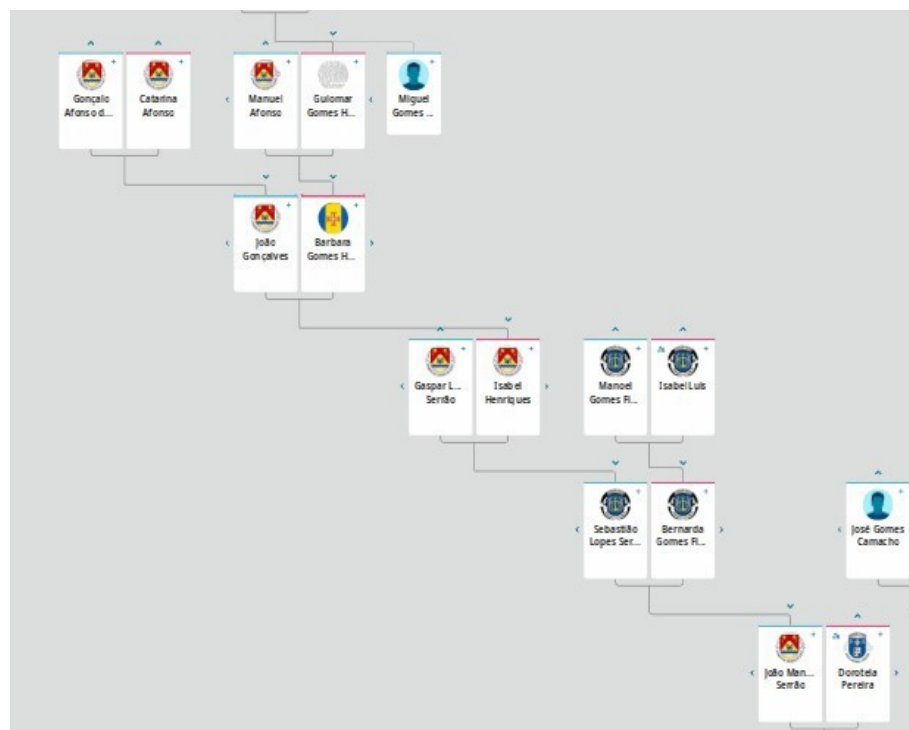
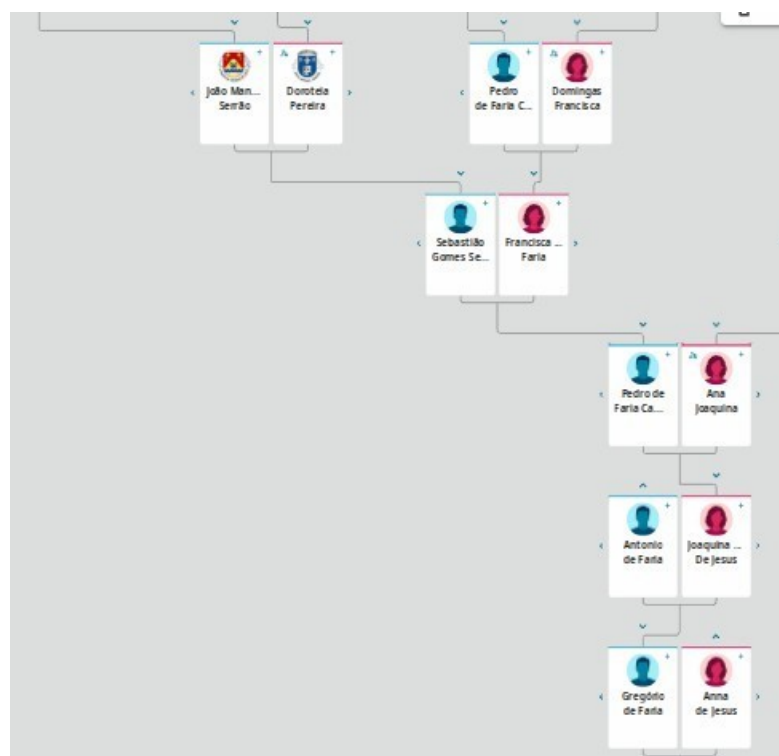
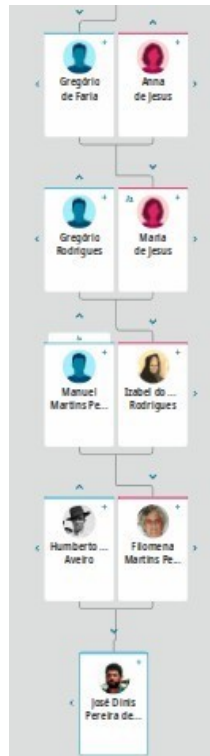


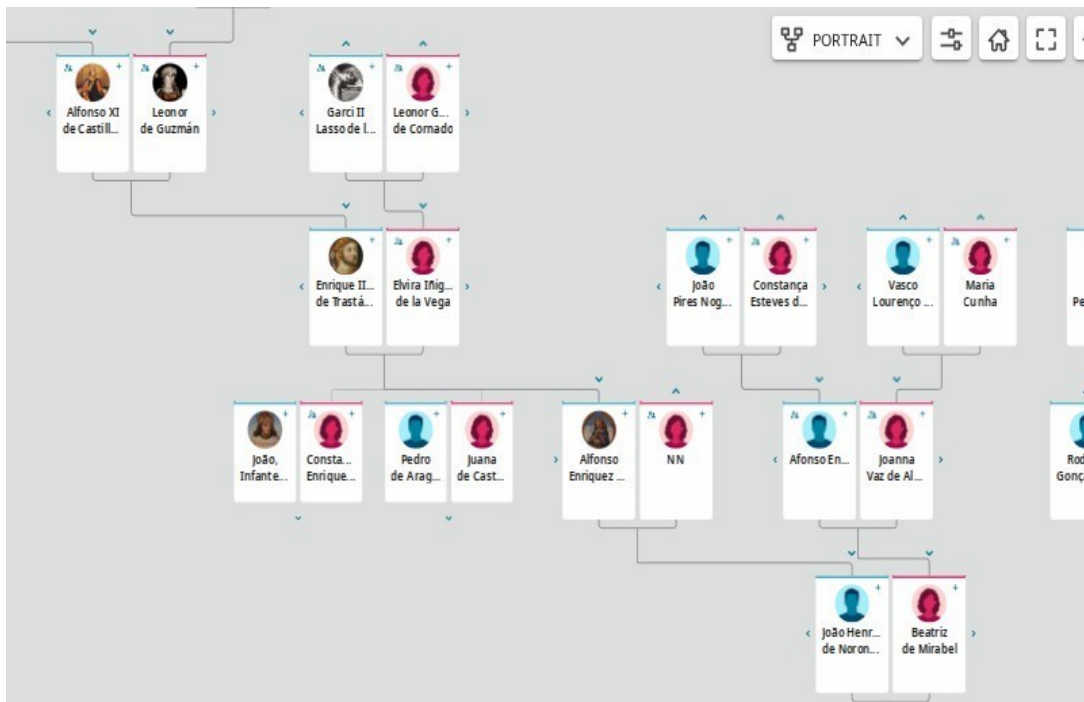
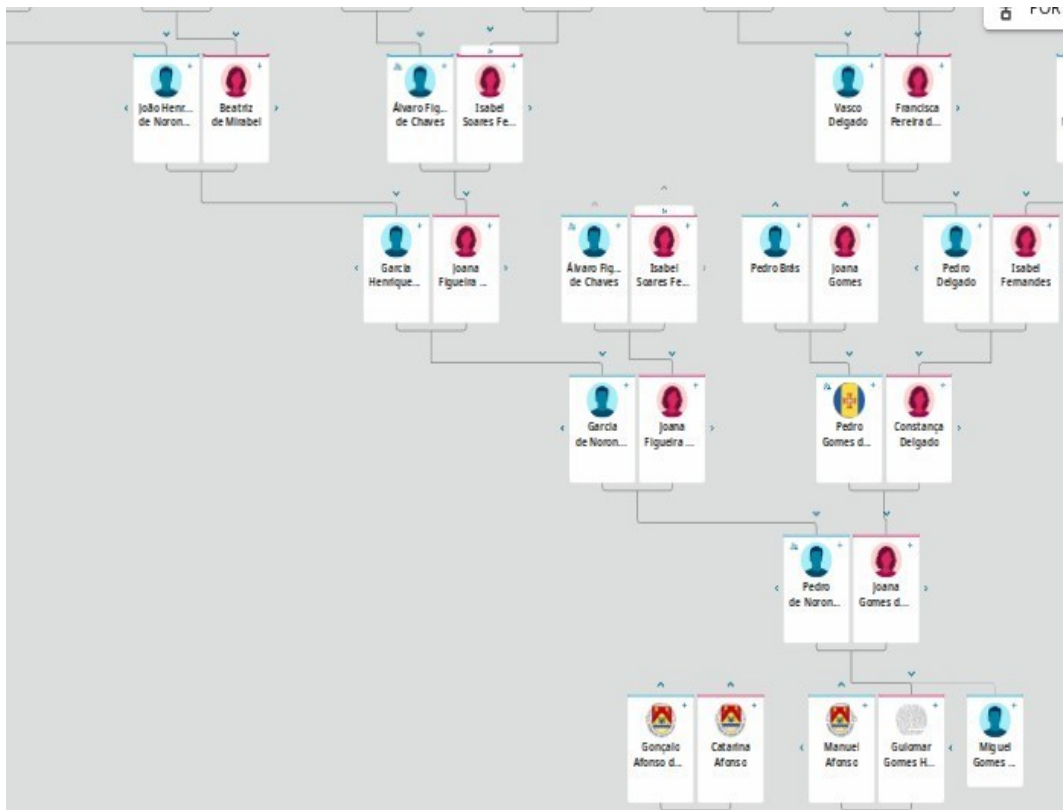
Most of his fans will recognize this screenshot, taken from a YouTube video that allegedly shows him working. It first appeared in his 2015 documentary [*Ronaldo*](#), with the intent of portraying CR7 as a poor, unprivileged Gentile. But that video is misdirection, for multiple reasons: First, street cleaners don't work in flip-flops and shorts. Second, [a simple glance at his Wiki page](#) informs us that when Ronaldo was 12, he signed for Sporting CP, which put him on a salary and relocated him to Lisbon—so why is he still sweeping the streets? He's obviously older than 12 there. For comparison, check out this picture [where we're told he is 13](#):

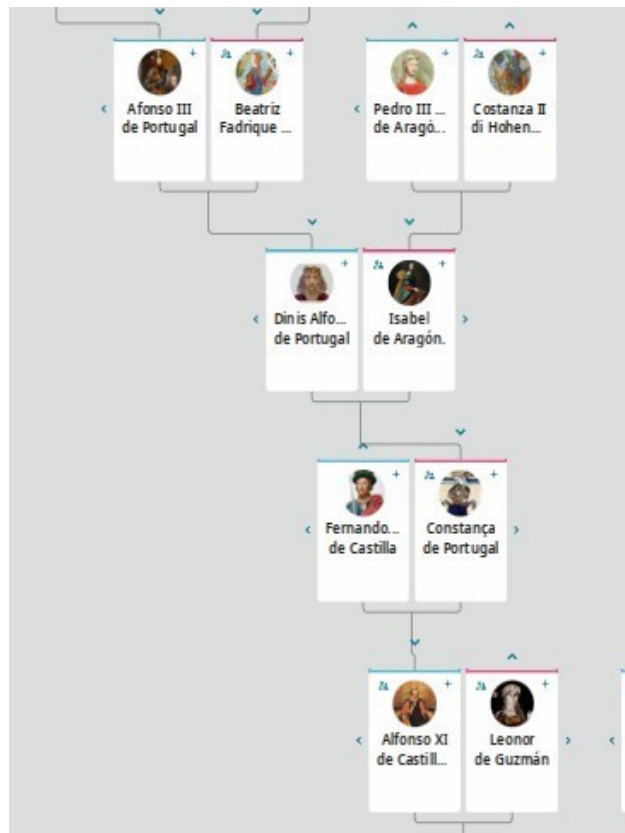


And third, Cristiano's full name is *Cristiano **Ronaldo dos Santos Aveiro***. That's a lot of names for an unprivileged kid, you have to admit. Wiki tells us his mother is Maria Dolores dos Santos Viveiros Aveiro, who worked as a cleaning woman before CR7's big break. Yes, a lady with five names worked crappy Gentile jobs. The usual propaganda. His father was José Dinis Aveiro, a man who died as a result of alcoholism caused by PTSD from his time in the Portuguese army, specifically when serving in Angola during the [Portuguese Colonial War](#). All part of the feel-sad-for-CR7 narrative of course, but right now I want you to focus on the fact that neither of them has Ronaldo in their names. So where does it come from? [Here](#) we find that Ronaldo is a name given to him because of Ronald Reagan, whom CR7's father liked even before he entered politics... back when he was *an actor*. Ok, we can take a hint. If we search around the internet just a little more, we find that [ancestry.com tells us](#) Ronaldo means **ruler**. To show you this is correct, I have to expose the true backstory of CR7.

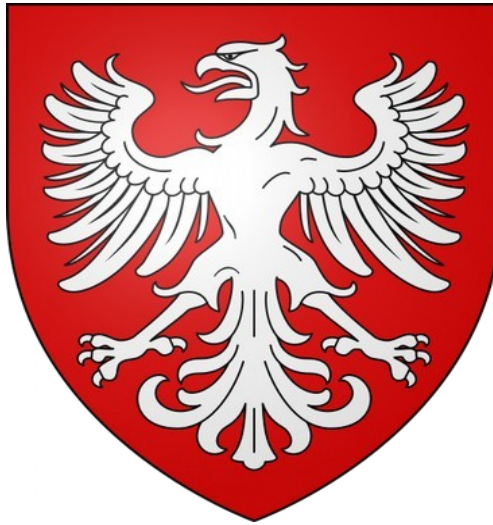
As usual, our approach is genealogical analysis—this time using [Familysearch](#), a genealogy website that only requires you to make a free account, which you can do with a temporary email. I like it more than Geni, because it provides a visual tree and doesn't bombard me with annoying captchas that disrupt my research, [but you can follow along there as well](#). Just click on the right names. Both hyperlinks take you to CR7's father's page, who is our starting point. Now, if you'll follow me:







I like to be thorough, so that no one accuses me of rushing to conclusions, which is why I reprinted all those pages. And there we have it, ladies and gentlemen. [Alfonso XI](#) ([Geni link here](#)) was King of Castile and León, and he is in the direct line of Ronaldo. His father comes from the Castilian House of Burgundy, a branch descended from Raymond of Burgundy, son of [William I](#), [one of the wealthiest European rulers at the time](#). Another one of William's sons was Guy of Burgundy, who became [Pope Callixtus II](#), the head of the Catholic Church and ruler of the Papal States. [Henry of Burgundy](#), founder of the Portuguese House of Burgundy—from which Constance, Alfonso's mother, descends—was Raymond and Guy's cousin. Henry's son was Afonso I, the first King of Portugal. Herzog, the author of the Anthony of Padua paper I hyperlinked to just above, connected Afonso I to [Godfrey of Bouillon](#), who led the first Crusade, became [the first King of Jerusalem](#) and was the great-great-grandfather of St. Anthony.

Alfonso XI's maternal grandmother was [Saint Elizabeth of Aragon](#) from the House of Barcelona. Her mother was Constance of Sicily, daughter of [Manfred](#), King of Sicily from the Hohenstaufen dynasty, and Beatrice of Savoy. Alfonso is also linked to the Árpád Dynasty of Hungary through his maternal great-great-grandmother, Yolanda/Violant of Hungary, **which means Alfonso XI, and therefore CR7, are direct descendants of King Andrew II of Hungary, also known as Andrew of Jerusalem, leader of the Fifth Crusade.**

Alfonso XI's paternal grandfather was Sancho IV, who had an illegitimate/out-of-wedlock daughter named Violante Sánchez of Castile, the mother of Pedro Fernández de Castro. This made Pedro a first cousin to Alfonso XI. Pedro is the 4^h-great-grandson of the founder of the House of Castro, [which Fidel Castro, the CIA agent, admitted is Jewish.](#)

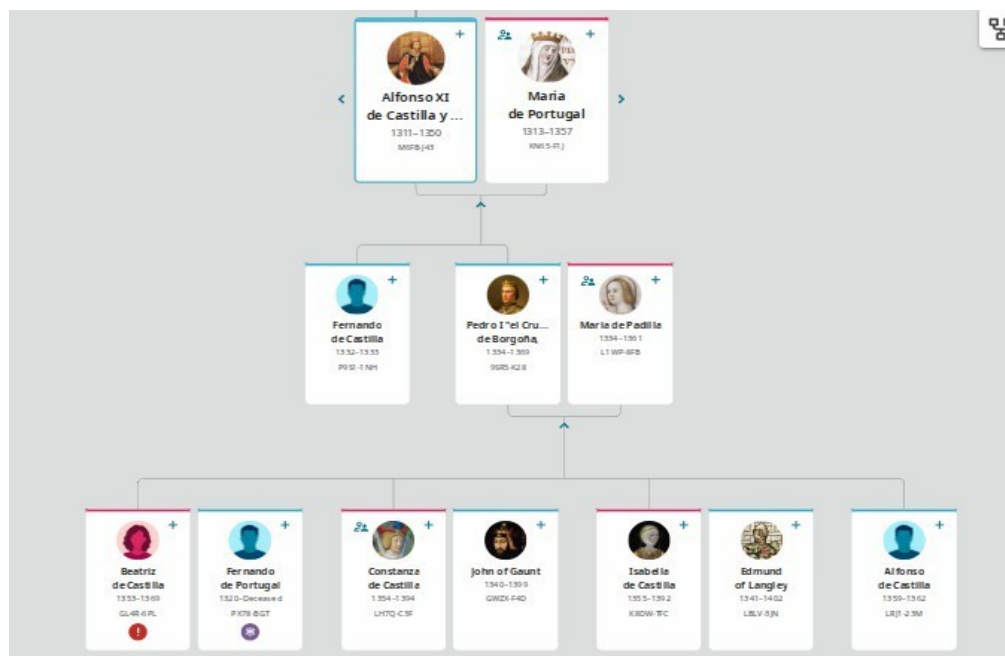
Alfonso's paternal great-great-grandparents were Ferdinand III and [Elisabeth of Swabia](#). Not only does Elisabeth link us to the House of Hohenstaufen again, but her maternal grandfather was Isaac II Angelos, Byzantine Emperor from the House of Komnene. [Eleanor of Aquitaine](#), one of the wealthiest and most powerful people of her time, was the great-grandmother of Ferdinand III and wife of Henry II, Plantagenet of England. Before marrying Henry II, Eleanor was married to Louis VII of France, with whom she had [Marie of France](#). Marie and Henry of Burgundy share the same ancestor, [Robert II](#), making them 2nd cousins twice removed. She married Henry I, Count of Champagne. Their sons were [Henry II](#), another King of Jerusalem, and [Theobald III](#), whose marriage with Blanche of Navarre reconnected their family with Castille.

Alfonso's mistress was Leonor de Guzmán, from the Andalusian branch of the House of Guzmán, with whom he had ten children. Their descendants established several of Spain's most distinguished noble lines, including the House of Trastámara, the House of Enríquez, the Marquesses of Aguilar de Campoo, and the Countship of Alburquerque. Regarding the broader

influence of the Guzmán lineage, Herzog notes:

This family became one of the most prominent dynasties of the Spanish kingdom until the 18th century. The original family gave rise to several branches, one of which became Dukes of Medina Sidonia from the 15th century to the 18th century, in turn giving rise to other branches including the Count-Dukes of Olivares (House of Alba). In 1802, María Cayetana de Silva, 13th Duchess of Alba, died without any issue and her titles were inherited by a relative, Carlos Miguel Fitz-James Stuart, 14th Duke of Alba. Thus, the dukedom of Alba passed to the senior branch of the House of Fitz-James Stuart, which took over the patrimony of the House of Alba. If you read Miles, you know the name Stuart.

We also find that Alfonso is the paternal grandfather of [Constance of Castile](#), the second wife of John of Gaunt.



This leads us back to CR7's paternal name: Aveiro—which ties him to [the Dukes of Aveiro](#), the most influential aristocratic house in Portugal after the notorious Braganzas. The title *de Aveiro* was first given by King John III of Portugal to his 2nd cousin, John of Lencastre=Lancaster, the 4th-great-grandson of John of Gaunt, 1st Duke of Lancaster, who [we know was a Komnene](#). The mainstream wants us to believe the Dukes of Aveiro went extinct in 1759 due to conspiring against the King, but, as we see, they are still alive and well.

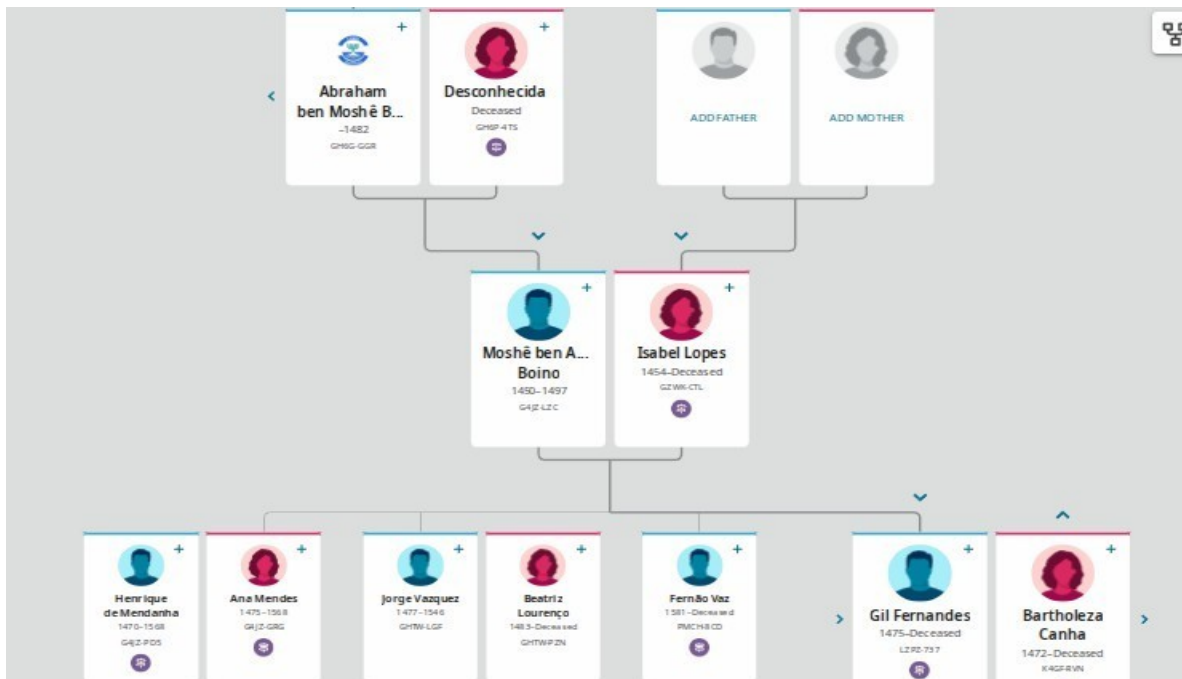
There's still more good stuff in José's genealogy that I want to show you. To reach the first major connection, we have to go back to [Antonio de Faria](#) ([Geni](#)) from screenshot #2. Because I want to avoid cluttering this paper with too many screenshots, I'll introduce a simple way of navigating you through the dense genealogy jungle: starting from Antonio, I'll refer to his father as M, and his mother as F. If I say M, you click or follow the father. When there, I'll again tell you M or F, and you just click/follow the right person. That's all. Ok, to come to our next stop, use this combination¹: FMFMM,FFMFM. That last M should be [John Drummond V](#) ([Geni](#))! He docked in Madeira—CR7's birthplace—during the first wave of the island's colonization and lived under the alias João Escórcio, which means John of Scotland. He was the son of Sir John Drummond of Cargill and Stobhall and Lady Elizabeth Sinclair, daughter of Henry I Sinclair, Earl of Orkney, a major feudal lord in northern Scotland and the Isles. The Drummonds were later dukes. Through his father, João was also a nephew of Annabella Drummond, Queen of Scots. This means [Ronald Reagan](#) isn't just a dead-end, because his maternal roots are Scottish; more specifically, his maternal 15th great-grandmother *was* Annabella Drummond², making CR7 and Reagan cousins. So that hit earlier wasn't just a coincidence.

Now, go back to Antonio's wife, Joaquina, and use this combination: MMMMF,FMFFM. The last M should be [Henrique Alemão](#), or [Władysław III of Poland](#), the eldest son of Władysław II, the [founder of the Jewish Jagiellon dynasty](#). Look at what Wiki says about Henrique: he faked his death, changed his name, and retired to a remote island. So, what else is new?

Again, go back a few steps, this time from Henrique/Władysław III to [Isabel Afonso Henriques](#) ([Geni](#)), and take a look at her husband, Pedro. The short MM route taken on Familysearch leads us to a [rabbi](#), who [Geni tells us](#) was a Jewish merchant and a Cohen. Interestingly, Geni doesn't link this rabbi to Gil Fernandes, despite heavy overlap between the lineages provided by the two platforms—so to play it safe, we'll leave a question mark next to this connection.

1 Some of the combinations, like this one, don't work on Geni, unfortunately. They broke the links there. Also, the commas are just an aid to help you count your steps.

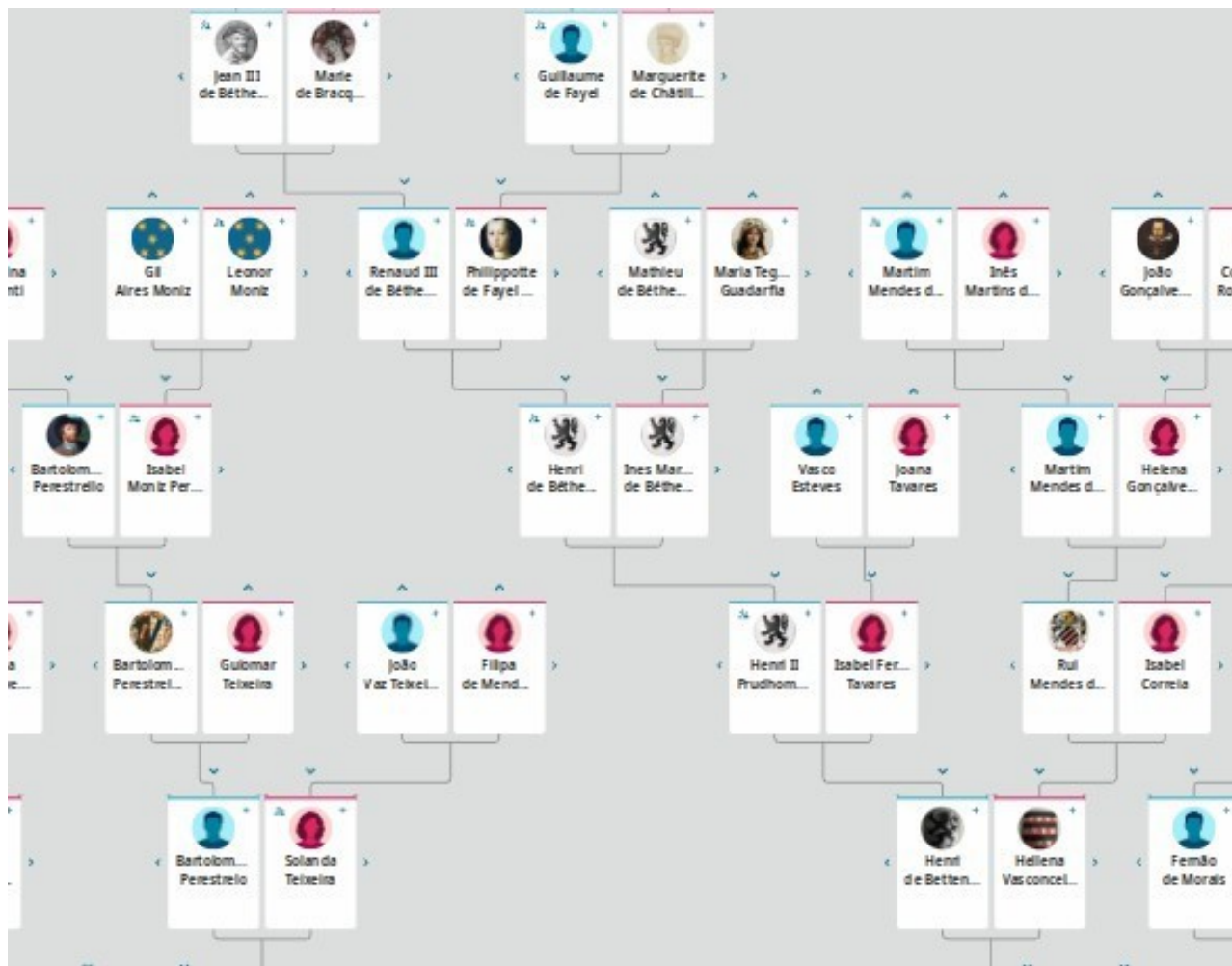

What the two platforms do agree on is Ronaldo's father's maternal surname: **Pereira**. Ah, just another clumsy omission made by the Wiki editors, right? We understand why they'd hide the Pereira name, being that it's another clear tell of CR7's Jewish heritage. In many papers written by Miles and his guest writers we've learned that Pereira is a Jewish name—[take this link and see for yourself](#)—and that its variants are Pérez/Peron. This links CR7 to many famous people, for example Evita Peron, [KGB agent Vladimir Putin](#), and Sean Penn, but also none other than... drumroll, please... [Lionel Messi](#), whose father is a Pérez! We're told that Messi's paternal great-grandfather, [Josep Pérez Solé](#), emigrated (sailed) to Argentina from **Catalonia**, a region historically intertwined with the families we've been studying thus far. [Looking at our previous research](#), we remember that Madeira is home to the Sousa Group, the largest Portuguese shipowner. Hmm. Solé=Solà=Sosa? CR7's godfather is Jose Fernao Barros de Sousa, so their families are closely linked, and I do not mean only spiritually. Additionally, it's interesting to note that the first European sailor to reach Argentina was the Portuguese Juan Díaz de Solís.

On José's father's side, through the combination MMFFF,MMFFF,FFMFMM,MMMMMM, we find him linked to [Jean III de Béthencourt](#), King of the Canary Islands. For more on the Phoenician Bettencourts, [see here](#). Being rulers of a nearby archipelago, it's no wonder the Bettencourts are linked to Madeira as well.

[Wikipedia](#) tells us the island was first inhabited in the 15th century by former Templars, [who we know were Jewish](#). These Templars, the founding fathers of Madeira, were: [João Gonçalves Zarco](#), [Tristão Vaz Teixeira](#) and [Bartolomeu Perestrelo](#).

Even though [Tristão Vaz Teixeira](#) isn't included in the screenshot, he is also related to CR7, because Guiomar Teixeira, the wife of Bartolomeu's son, is his daughter, and Tristão himself is a descendant of Alfonso III, through his mother. Before moving on, I want to remind you that Bartolomeu's daughter, Filipa Moniz Perestrelo, married the [Jewish Christopher Columbus](#), who was actually Chris Cohen. Yep, CR7 definitely is a ruler alright.

What about the name *dos Santos*? The mainstream tells us it simply means "of the saints" in Portuguese, and reflects a devotional surname tied to Roman Catholic tradition. That's actually another outing of CR7's Jewish background, because the term [crypto-Jews](#):

is especially applied historically to Spanish and Portuguese Jews who outwardly professed Catholicism, also known as Conversos, Marranos, or the Anusim.

Dos Santos is CR7's maternal name, which gives me the opportunity to formally introduce you to Maria Dolores dos Santos Viveiros Aveiro:



Wow. Could she have made it any easier for us? Her genealogy is completely scrubbed, except this bit I found on WikiTree, which shows a little of her father's genealogy. Notice the Fernandes/Hernandes name coming up, which is CR7's wife's maternal family name. Also, Georgina's paternal name is Rodríguez, which we saw before, with CR7's paternal great-grandmother.

The Viveiros are, to no ones surprise by now, also Jewish: check out Leonor de Vivero, a Jewish noblewoman who was part of the Illuminati and was allegedly killed by the Spanish Inquisition for heresy. Just more Jewish fabrication, as we know from Miles's Columbus paper.

The Rosários in Maria's genealogy are related to the de Ornelas=Orléans family, and the Silvas, Cayetana Fitz-James Stuart's maternal family name. The Rochas, a family we remember from an earlier paper, are present as well:

The name Rocha is Jewish, think Rocka-feller. All I did was go to thepeerage.com, where I immediately discovered the la Rochas of Portugal, Spain, Argentina and Brazil, related to the Bourbons. I could quit there, but I won't. On that page, we also find them related to

the Princes von Bayern, the Princes von Wittelsbach, the Bragancas, the d'Orleans, the von Croys, and the de Carvalhos.

The final family I'll bring up is [the peeraged Freitas line](#)—where “Branco” is a fudge of Franco. As we can see, they're linked to [the Croÿs](#) as well, but also the [d'Ailhaud de Brisis](#), and [de Lespinay=d'Espinay](#) noble families.
