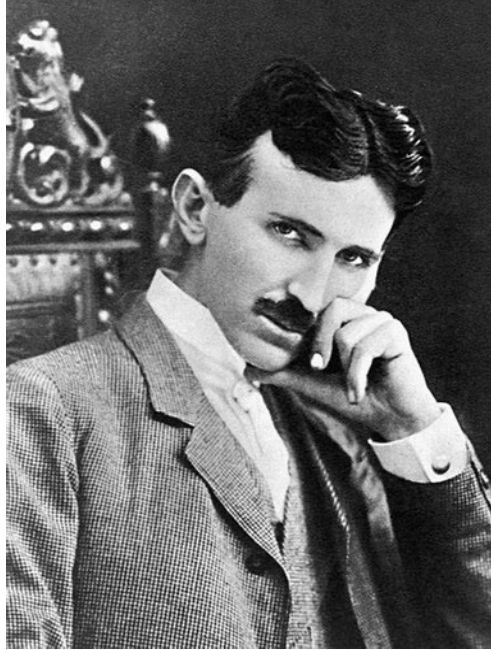


Nikola Tesla was Jewish

To start this paper, I'd like to share a story of Tesla's birth¹:

Family legend has it that a violent thunderstorm was raging at that moment, which frightened the village midwife. Fearful, the midwife said, "He'll be a child of the storm." In response, his mother replied, "No, of light."

Interesting, considering what Miles, an artist, [has shown us about light](#).

We'll begin our research with the usual, genealogy – I'm taking this [link](#) first, where, before even starting, we are met with Mary [Cummins](#), the owner of this family tree. **Cummins=Commene**. She says:

My specialty is older genealogy for Mexicans, Spaniards, African Americans and Jewish people.

According to the mainstream Nikola Tesla isn't in any of those categories... Or is he?

The first thing that jumped out at me is the name of Nikola's mother – *Georgina* Mandić. That's a very strange first name for someone with Serbian roots. They try to hide that name from us locals, telling us it was Đuka, or in Serbian Cyrillic Ђука. This you can clearly see here²:



A 19th century Christian family writing someone's nickname as their first name on a tombstone, especially without even mentioning her real name? Very suspicious.

A similar and very telling example is “Serbian” model [Georgina Stojiljković](#), who Wiki says was given the name Đurđa. The difference here is that one wanted to accentuate her Phoenician heritage, while the other tried to conceal it.

Moving on in our analysis, [Nikola's Wiki page](#) tells us:

Tesla's mother, Georgina "Đuka" Mandić (1822–1892), whose father was also an Eastern Orthodox priest,[12] had a talent for making home craft tools and mechanical appliances and the ability to memorize Serbian epic poems. Đuka had never received a formal education.

To think that an illiterate woman living in a small village would ever even try tinkering with such things is ludicrous to me, yet Tesla credits her as being the source of his inspiration, saying:

² The tombstone reads: “Here lies Đuka Tesla, the wife of Prote Tesle.” Prote is a title Milutin held in the Orthodox church, so don't think it's the name of another man.

My mother was an inventor of the first order and would, I believe, have achieved great things had she not been so remote from modern life and its multifold opportunities. She invented and constructed all kinds of tools and devices and wove the finest designs from thread which [sic] was spun by her....

Continuing:

She worked regularly from four o'clock in the morning till eleven in the evening. ... She directed the servants to take care of all our domestic animals, she milked the cows, she performed all sorts of labor unassisted, set the table, prepared breakfast for the whole household.

Tesla's family had servants. Nuff said.

So Tesla was not from a family of Orthodox priests, he was from a family of Jewish nobles and merchants, some of whom were posing as Orthodox priests, both to hide and to blow Christianity from the inside.

Moving on in the genealogy tree, Tesla's maternal grandmother is Sofija **Budisavljević**, which links Nikola Tesla to the Jewish president of Yugoslavia, [Josip Broz Tito](#). What outs this family's covert operations is that in Georgina's instance they're represented as Orthodox Christians who have a deep relationship with God, but in [Jovanka's case](#) the family had no issues marrying their own to a religion-hating communist.

Sofija's father was [Toma Budisavljević](#), and we are given a picture of him:



Geneanet and Wiki both "forget" to mention his middle name is [Markov](#), Jewish, but the Croatian Wiki does tell us more about his father, who was [an Austrian noble](#). Since we're analyzing faces, I'll share another one, this time of one of Marko's great-great-grandsons, [Bude Budisavljević](#):



Notice the typical long-face, long-nose combination.

On Marko's Wiki page we find:

For bravery and military merit, the Austrian Emperor Joseph II of Habsburg granted him a noble title, a coat of arms, and the right to the noble predicate (Ehrenwort) Prijedorski at a ceremony in Vienna on the 26th of July, 1787.

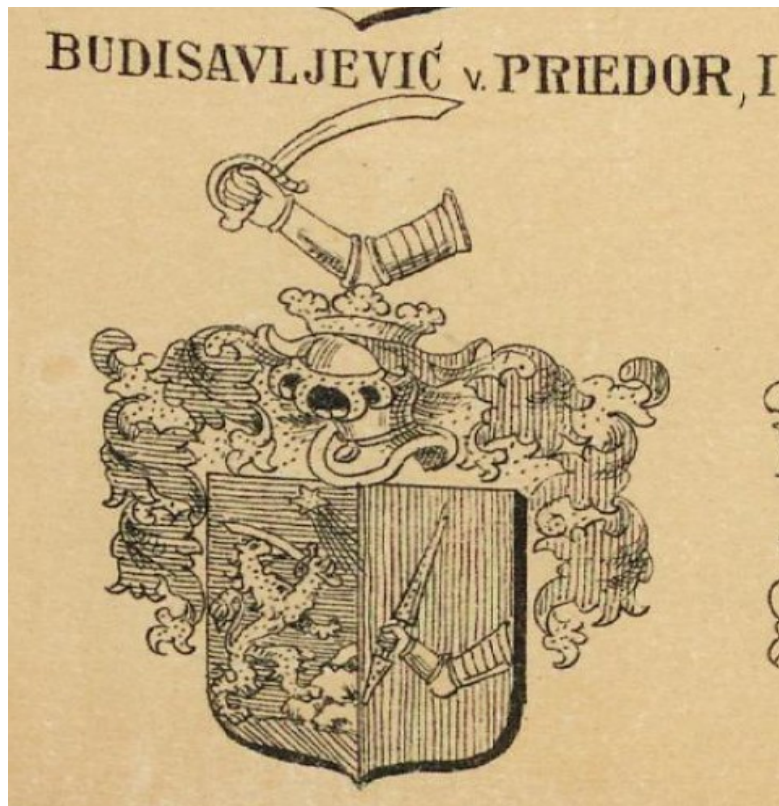
Very strange that a commoner would be allowed into the nobility for serving the army, which they were required to do by law, but the fun doesn't stop there:

Marko's younger son Petar (born 1756) was killed with Napoleon's army near Verona in 1805, and was buried in Verona.

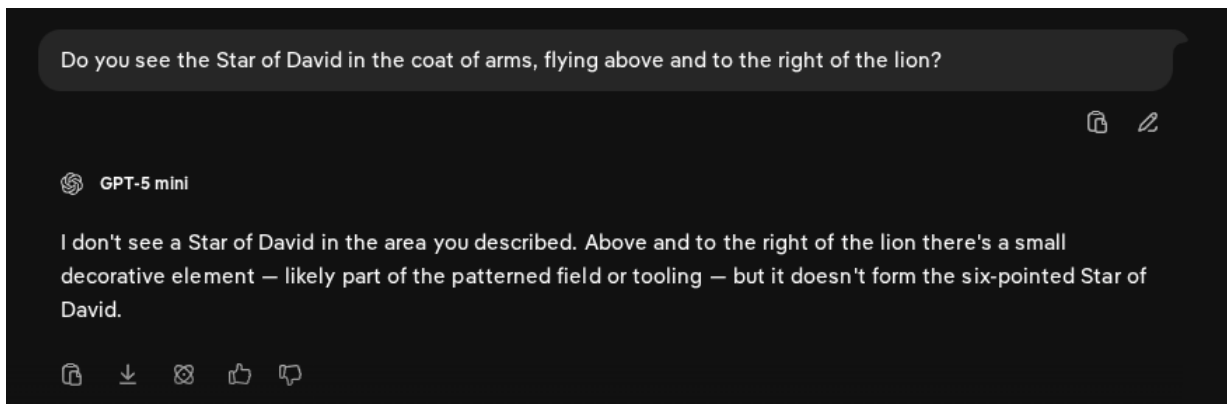
So, despite being given the title of nobility by [Joseph II](#) in 1787, [the Budisavljević family fought the battle at Verona against the Austrian army](#). That won't sit well with the Austrians, will it? Actually, they didn't mind it at all. Even though his family allegedly betrayed Joseph II, Tomo Budisavljević received two decorations from Francis II, who looked like this:



A Habsburg, and obviously Jewish. As for the Budisavljevićs, if we study [the Wiki page of this family](#), we find that they originated from [the House of Nemanjić](#), a famous dynasty in ancient Serbian history. *This won't be their last appearance.* For now, notice the Phoenix on the Nemanjić coat of arms. We are given the Budisavljević coat of arms as well, but, for better quality, I'm sharing [this one](#):



In the picture we see [the lion](#) and the Star of David, which ChatGPT fails to notice:



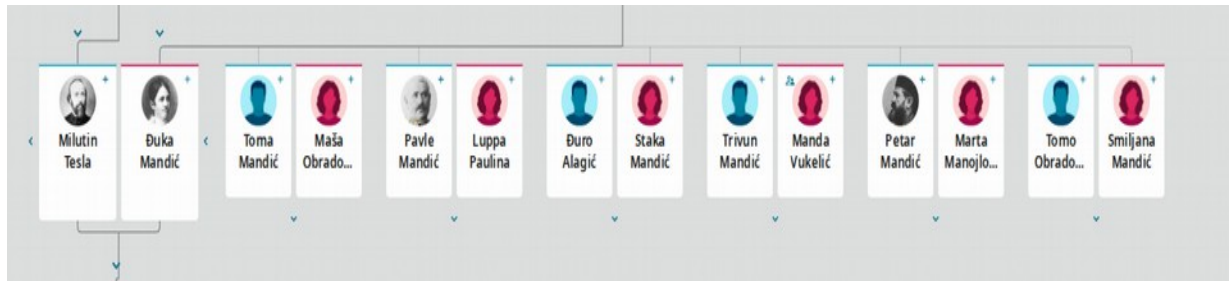
You must be blind GPT, or suffering from Milesophobia.

Let's switch course now and start analyzing the other side of Georgina's family, the Mandićs. As a first step, I'll quote a sentence I found [here](#):

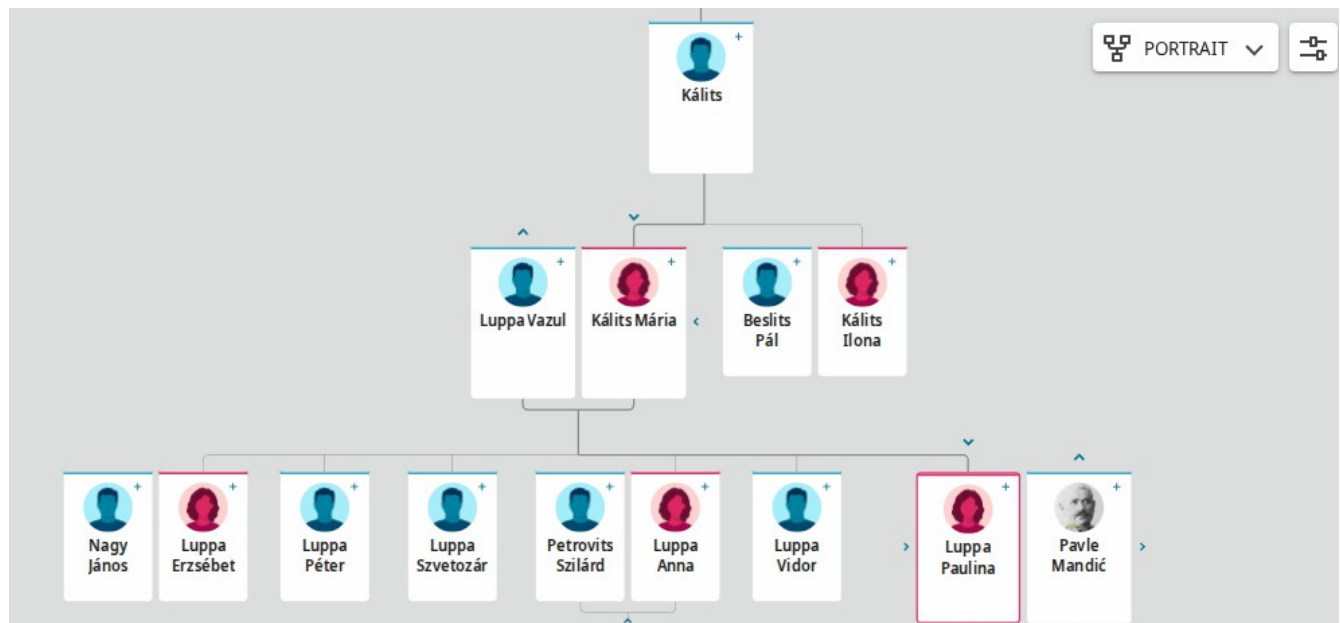
Already in Tesla's time, it was calculated that the Mandic family (to which Tesla's mother belonged) had exactly 36 Orthodox priests, taking into account vertical and lateral genealogical lines.

And we're supposed to believe this family allowed Nikola Mandić to marry Sofija, his very close blood relative? True Christian Orthodox families wouldn't allow that, but we know who would.

Since Geneanet is thoroughly scrubbed concerning the Mandićs I'll switch to [Geni](#), where the link I provide takes us to Sofija's page. There we can see that her husband is the son of Tomo **Petrov** Mandić, Jewish, also giving us a clue on who the [Petrović-Njegoš](#) family is. The middle names don't stop there, since Nikola Mandić's brothers and sisters all carry the middle name Tomin/Tomina. [He carries it too](#), of course, despite it being hidden from us at Geni.



I made that screenshot at Familysearch.org, a free genealogy website that only requires an account (which you can make with a free temporary email found on the internet) to use. Here we can see all of Georgina's brothers and sisters, excluding [Olga](#). I'll hit [Pavle Mandić](#), a colonel in the Austrian army whose descendants carry the last name [Madai](#). His wife's family is given below:



[Nagy is peerage](#). We also have [Imre Nagy](#), leader of the 1956 Hungarian Uprising and an admitted agent.

Also note the name Szilard there, which reminds us of fake nuclear physicist and spook Leo Szilard, born Leo Spitz (with all middle names hidden), admitted to be Jewish, who I hit hard in [my paper on Oppenheimer](#). Szilard means “solid” in Hungarian—compare to the fake name Stalin, which means steel. Leo Szilard was also a Vidor, see Luppa Vidor in the graphic above, telling us Leo was closely related to Tesla, something we aren't ever told.

The Luppa family [has an island named after them](#), which is on the Danube river, the second longest in Europe. I've found that information [here](#):

The small island on the Danube near Budapest (Lupa-sziget) is named after a Serb of Aromanian (Cincar) origin, Petar Lupa. In the mid-19th century he was a wealthy landowner, born in the nearby Pomáz.

A variant of the Luppa (meaning wolf) family is Luppis, leading us to [Giovanni Luppis](#), an officer of the navy, of course, but an even more important thing to note is that he's **"sometimes also known by the Croatian name of Vukić."** Keep that in mind.

The Kálits are also scrubbed, but I think their last name is the Hungarian version of Kalinić, which appears on Nikola's paternal side and allows us to connect Nikola Tesla to the Cohens. How did I come to that conclusion? Well, Serbian names that end in -ić are derived from your ancestor's name, which means that someone named Kalinić is a descendant of Kalin. That's another very strange name, with its meaning not known, despite what the mainstream Serbian websites are telling us, so I offer this simple explanation: Kalinić=Kalin=Cohen.

Miles: Remember Mikhail Kalinin, who made a big appearance on my papers on Lenin and Stalin, since he was nominal head of the Soviet Union from 1919 to 1946. Since all these top Bolsheviks were crypto-Jews pretending to be peasants, we can assume Kalinin is an Ashkenazy name. Which would make Kalinic the Serbian version of the Russian Kalinin. Kalinin married a [Lorberg](#), supposed to be from Estonia but obviously Jewish again. Of course Wikipedia scrubs her parents. Kalin may indeed be a slur of Kohen.

The name Beslits is a variation of Bešlić, which Balkan readers will instantly recognize if they know who [Halid Bešlić](#) was. For those that don't, he was a famous folk singer with some beautiful love songs. But we already know he didn't become famous just because he was a good singer.

While searching the internet for more information about Pavle Mandić, I've found something very interesting. You are probably familiar with Mileva Marić, Einstein's wife, since Miles has written about her on his science site, outing her as a Marx. Well, RTS (Radio Televizija Srbije - Radio Television of Serbia) [published an article about Marina Bulatović](#), who is writing a novel about some of the greatest Serbian minds. Nikola Tesla is included, and she tells us:

Nikola Tesla and Mileva Marić never met. But Mileva's uncle Radovan Marić and Tesla's uncle Pavle "Paja" Mandić were friends. Mileva's uncle was an Austrian officer and a baron, a recipient of the Takovo Cross, second class.

Tesla's uncle, a colonel, lived in Hungary. For a time, Mileva's uncle was stationed in Budapest and while there every January celebrated Saint Stephen, the Marić family's patron day, inviting fellow officers to dinner. Tesla's uncle was always among the guests. The world is truly small!"
— Marina Bulatović revealed to us at the end of the conversation.

Marina would like us to laugh this off as a funny coincidence, but I'll try to see if there's something more here. Looking at Mileva's [Familysearch](#) and [Geni](#) pages we don't find her uncle Radovan listed. Hmm. Could it be that the Marić and Mandić families are related? Remember, Miles suggested Maric=Marks=Marx.

To find that out I went to another of Georgina's brothers: [Trivun Mandić](#), whose daughter married [Alojzj Marunich](#). [We know Einstein was a very rich Jew](#), meaning Mileva must've been one too, and it's obvious that Alojzj is a variant of the Jewish Alois/Aloysius, which tells us the Marunić/Marunich are also Jewish, so the last piece of the puzzle would need to be Marunić=Marić.

Alojzj Marunich is also related to the Vračar family, [which is the name of a wealthy Belgrade municipality](#) where the Nikola Tesla museum is located. There are various explanations of the name for the municipality, which I read as misdirection from this family, so I would like to propose it's due to this wealthy family owning that piece of land.

While here, let's take a deeper look at Trivun's descendants, starting with their last names. We find: Pence, Shields, Summers, Peters, Signorelli, Evdokinoff=Evdokinov=Evdokimov, Kakstis, Anisedon=Aniston, Romano=Romanov, Tokar=Tokarev, and Dobis.

Going further, we find that Daniel married Antoinette, who's coming from the Grechowsky=Grochowska/Grochowski=Gronkowski=Grochowski=Grochowski and Scrubba/Scrubb families.

Olga married Frank Signorelli, related to the Zaffaro=Zaffaroni=Zaffirini=Zaffino=Zaffar/Zafar family.

Nicholas Louis Marunich married [Esther Williams](#) Evdokinoff=Evdokinov=Evdokimov, who's also linked to the Shubin family. [The Esther Williams part of that is also curious, it being the name of a famous swimmer and actress of the 1940s and 50s. Her mother was a Gilpin, Jewish.](#)

Vedasava Marunich, Nikola Tesla's first cousin once removed, married Peter Paul Peters, who's related to the Daniloff/Danilov, Akemoba=Akimova/Akimov, Evanoff, and then horrible fudges Petunoff, which I take as Petroff/Petrov, and Kuznuic, which I think is Kuzmić=Kuzmin/Kuzmina, a variation of Comnene. Kuzmin=[Kuzmyn](#)=Comyn=Comnene.

Hold the phone ladies and gentlemen. I have discovered something beautiful. Tesla's first cousin Vedasava's daughter, Ruth Ann Peters, married [Richard James Shields](#), and I encourage you to look at his family tree for yourself – it's a goldmine, since it leads us all the way back to William the Conqueror!

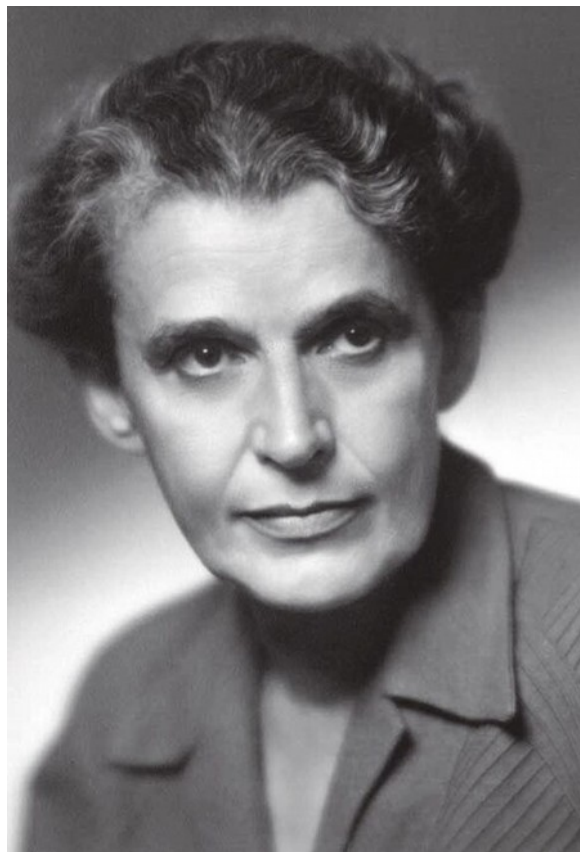
Miles: I remind you that Brooke Shields is listed in the British peerage, since she comes from the Campbells and Torlonias, Princes of Civitella-Cesi, who are also Roveres, Princes of Farnese, and Sforzas. The Shields are also Dunbars, Forbes, Balfours, Gordons and MacKenzies, taking us back to the Stuarts. In another line, the Shields are also Benoistes, linking them back to the Princes von Croy and the Grafts von Lilienstein and the Grafts von Solms. In the US, they were some of the wealthiest residents of Natchez before moving to California in the early 1900s.

Let's be thorough and finish up Trivun's family, since these names will help in our future research. Mildred married Edward W. Dobis/Dobisz, also related to the Lopatka/Lapatka, Ziajac/Ziaja, [Pietrzak](#)/Pietrzek (fake murder promoting race-wars alert), Ziarko=Zarkov (called Stanley, mother a Starko/Starkov/Starkoff), Kowalewski=Kowalevski=Kovalevski=Kovalev=[Kovalov](#) (fake assassination alert), [Szymoniak](#) (related to the [Kochs](#)), Herrle (related to the Goodyear and Kärcher families) and McNeil families.

In this case [Georgia Miletus Sires](#), Nikola Tesla's cousin-in-law from Mildred's marriage with Edward, is the one who takes us straight to the top of the peerage, with links to the Mays, Burroughs, Roses, Taylors and Duffs.

George Eric Marunich married Marie Romano=Romanov, related to the Piacenti/Piacentini family. And, last but not least, Melva "Babs" Marunich married Stephen John Tokar, also related to the Ponda=Pondal=Pond, Draganovsky=Draganov, Kendra, Balent, Babuscsak, [Mačejovská](#), Hess, Langlotz=Langlois, Kruczek, Kibelbek, [Petro](#), Bonk=Bak, Garman, Thomas, Maslanik=Maslany=Maslansky, Guriel/[Gurieli](#), Kendgia, Yankosky=Yankovsky=Yankowski, [Horak](#), Humenik, Watkins, Lindsay, Squitero=Squitieri, Mazza, Deluca/De Luca families.

Ooh! Check this out as well: [Marija Mandić](#) married a Majstorović, which gives us the perfect opportunity to introduce Nikola Tesla's second cousin-in-law, [Diana Frieda Olga Obexer](#):



She's sold as a heroine for rescuing Orthodox women and children from Ustaše concentration camps like Jasenovac and Stara Gradiška. Turns out she didn't have to go through all the trouble, because [Miroslav Filipović](#), full name Miroslav Filipović-**Majstorović**, was the commander of those two camps! So he was her first cousin. The power of genealogy.

Let me score another basket by quickly mentioning basketball coach [Dušan Ivković](#), whose grandmother, Olga Mandić, [was Georgina's sister](#). We can make two more important links here, as we see that Olga's daughter carries the name [Obrovčić](#), who, surprise surprise, became head coach of FR Yugoslavia after Dušan left in 1995. The other is found by seeing that Nikola Tesla's paternal great-

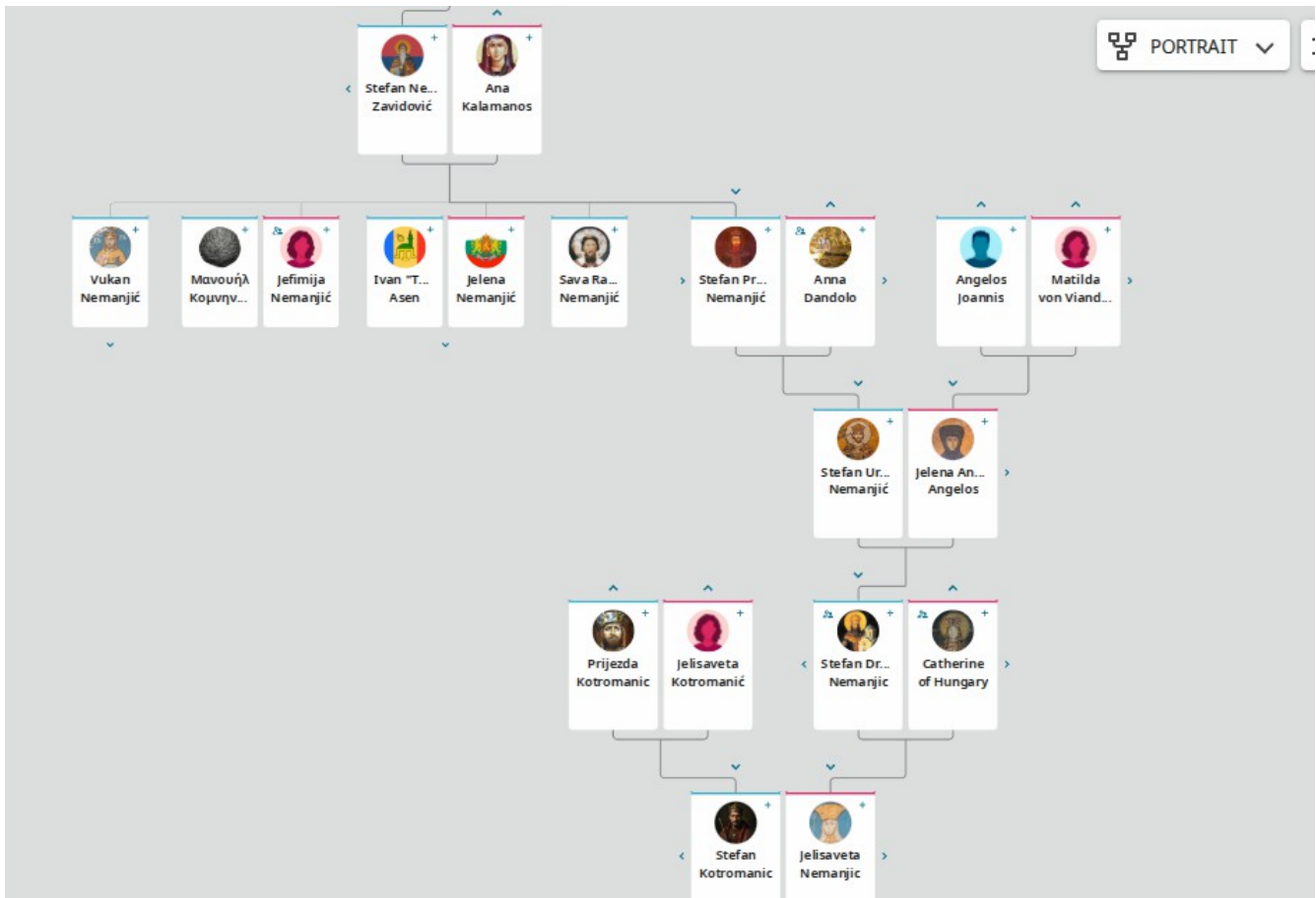
great-grandmother carried the last name Popović, as in [Gregg Popovich](#). That links us to a lot of famous people, including swimmer Alex Popov.

Now we'll switch our focus to Nikola Tesla's father Milutin:



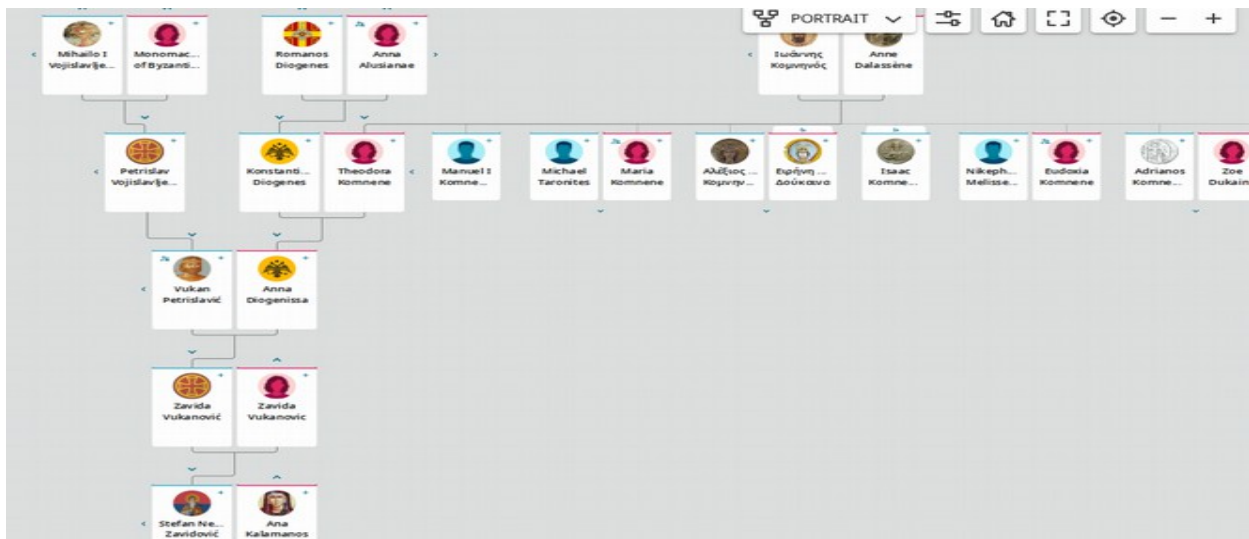
An Orthodox priest with a Phoenician medal instead of a cross!

Remember that I told you the Nemanjić dynasty wasn't going to appear only once? Well, following Milutin Tesla's ancestors on Familysearch (or Geni), we have a direct link to [Stefan Nemanja](#), the founder of the Nemanjić dynasty! Milutin's great-great-grandfather, Tomislav Neznan (meaning unknown in Serbian) Tesla II, married Zorka Markova Ždero, and following her paternal side we come to Katarina Kotromanić, daughter of [Jelisaveta Nemanjić](#)! Here's the visual:



Furthermore, notice how Familysearch tells us Katarina’s and Nikola Toljenić’s son Vladislav carries the name Nikolić, as in former Serbian president [Tomislav Nikolić](#). The Nikolić surname later changes to **Vukić**; do you know who was the next Serbian president after Tomislav? [Aleksandar Vučić](#)=**Vukić**.

Coming to the founding figure of this dynasty we understand why Mary Cummins was interested in Tesla’s genealogy:



We can still make some very important links. Familysearch made a mistake when linking the wife of Marko Petrov Ždero, with the correct connection being found at [Geni](#), which shows Zorka's mother as Marja Avgustovic, daughter of [Augustus von Bismarck](#), who was Otto's great-grandfather!

Zorka Ždero had a sister named Lilalet von Schlange (German for snake), who had two husbands, one of which is [Johannes Alexanderovich von Schlange](#), whose granddaughter married Vladimir Ivanovich Menshikov and was the mother of [Mikail Vladimirovich Hand](#). They are showing us their hand with this one, since Mikail shares the same middle name as [Vladimir Vladimirovich Putin](#)! The Snakes are, as we see, related to **ALL** of the richest "Russian" families.

We also have to point out Lilalet Jovanovic, who is carrying the same name as her mother, because it connects us to [Jovan Jovanović, nicknamed Zmaj](#), a poet whose book, along with 4 cents, Tesla brought with him when first arriving to America. Zmaj means dragon in Serbian, and a dragon is just a big snake, so that's who he really was: a relative!

We can't leave out Lilalet Jovanović's half sister, Henriette Müller/Muller. Her husband is a [Flügge](#), and their daughter carries five names. Tells us everything we need to know, but I'll point out some peerage names I found: Dieterich(s) (meaning people ruler), Riepenhausen=Rittenhouse, Christiani/Christian, Conerding/Konerding, Engelbrecht, Stisser, Kramer, [Goldstein](#), [Schuster \(as in Syblia Schuster, the sister of Donald Trump's great-grandfather!\)](#), Niemeyer.

I have one more presidential link up my sleeve, since one of Nikola's sisters, [Angelina Trbojević](#), married J ovo, whose sister Sofija Milivojević was the mother of Jelena [Borić](#), sharing the same last name as the former president of, you'll never guess it, [Chile](#)!

I would also like to direct your attention to one of Jelena's daughters, Mara Mišćević. Do you know who the richest individual in Serbia is? [Miroslav Mišković](#), a man with no family background.

Miles: I re-read Tesla's bio as back-up for this paper. We are told he graduated at 17, then immediately got cholera, being bedridden for nine months and nearly dying. In the next paragraph we find this:

The next year, Tesla evaded conscription into the Austro-Hungarian Army in Smiljan by running away southeast of Lika to Tomingaj, near Gračac.[citation needed] There he explored the mountains wearing hunter's garb.[citation needed] Tesla said that this contact with nature made him stronger, both physically and mentally.[citation needed] He enrolled at the Imperial-Royal Technical College in Graz in 1875 on a Military Frontier scholarship.

That makes no sense. After nearly dying of cholera, he fled the army and lived in the mountains? And the army never found him, even after he enrolled in the Imperial-Royal College? They would never think to check the rolls there for deserters, right? So this is the usual horse manure we are used to.

Tesla was supposedly a star student as a freshman, but flunked out by his third year, due to gambling and womanizing. Really? Tesla? Doesn't match his later bio, where he wouldn't be caught dead in a gambling parlor or with a woman. So they are covering something here as well. Probably that his obsessive-compulsiveness prevented him from existing in the normal world at university.

From Wiki:

Tesla disagreed with the theory that atoms were composed of smaller [subatomic particles](#), stating there was no such thing as an [electron](#) creating an electric charge.[\[citation needed\]](#) He believed that if electrons existed at all, they were some fourth state of matter or "sub-atom" that could exist only in an experimental vacuum, and that they had nothing to do with electricity.[\[216\]](#) Tesla believed that atoms are immutable—they could not change state or be split in any way. He was a believer in the 19th-century concept of an all-pervasive [ether](#) that transmitted electrical energy.[\[citation needed\]](#)

How could the man who knew more about electricity than anyone alive believe that? Well, I am perhaps the only one in the world who can tell you how. [I have since shown](#) that although electrons exist, they don't do anything the mainstream tells us they do, including orbit the nucleus or cause bonds. It is now known that [electric current is not caused by the flow of electrons down the line](#), though they still try to hide that fact. All of these things are caused by the real charge field, which is what Tesla is calling the ether. [Charge is a gas of real spinning photons](#), ie LIGHT!, recycled through the nucleus in defined channels, different for each element. The charge also flows between atoms and molecules, creating the bonds and alignments. So Tesla was mostly right. This paper wasn't about burying Tesla, it was about trying to understand his bio and his life, his promotion and his anti-promotion.
