This is Getting Weird

It has been a very strange two weeks, as I think anyone will agree. Even if you are 100% with Trump, you have to admit nothing even close to this has ever happened before. Personally I am with Ron Paul in finding the attack on USAid welcome and overdue. The place has long been a front for CIA. And this running the country by executive order may seem necessary in the short term, considering how corrupt Congress has long been.
